

Eligibility by Program:

LEAP:

- Grades 1-5
- Special education students identified with an emotional-behavioral disability
- Referred by case manager with approval of Principal and Special Education Coordinator to Intensive Support Team ([IST Request for Support](#))

Primary Steps:

- Have a special education diagnosis
- Serves Students in 1st-5th grade
- Referral made to Intensive Support Team – [request for support](#)
- Ability to function safely in small group settings
- Potential to participate in a therapeutic environment with adult support
 - Motivated by relationship
 - Some internal locus of control
 - Ability to access DBT/CBT (talk therapy)
- Parent willing to actively participate in program
- Min. of low average or average IQ
- Spectrum issues will be discussed on a case by case basis

NEON:

- Referral made to Intensive Support Team - [request for support](#)
- Grades 6-8 (no 2nd Sem - 8th)
- Special education students identified with an emotional-behavioral disability
- FBA/BIP in place and & implemented with fidelity for 90 days
- Full day at program or partial day split between program and home school
- Placement also based on current openings

School Based Alternative (SBA) Program:

- Grades 6-8 (no second semester 8th)
- Student must have an IEP to be eligible, time limit is IEP based
- FBA/BIP in place and implemented with fidelity for 90 days
- Full day at program or partial day split between home school and SBA Site
- Upon eligibility criteria being met, placement based on current program openings

Next Steps:

- Have a special education diagnosis
- Serves Students in 6th-8th grade
- Referral made to Intensive Support Team – [request for support](#)
- Ability to function safely in small group settings
- Potential to participate in a therapeutic environment with adult support
 - Motivated by relationship
 - Some internal locus of control
 - Ability to access DBT/CBT (talk therapy)
- Parent willing to actively participate in program
- Min. of low average or average IQ
- Spectrum issues will be discussed on a case by case basis

Foundations Central:

- Students with IEPs
- Students aged 18-21 who would be in their 5th year of high school
- Full day at program or a hybrid of it
- Upon eligibility criteria being met, placement based on current program openings

Restore:

- Participation in this program is offered for certain behaviors as an alternative to going through the expulsion process. Students attending Restore are not expelled, and if they successfully complete their time at Restore they will have their expulsion recommendation dismissed completely.

RePLAY:

- MMSD, Dane County & parent or guardian must approve the student enrolling in this semester-long program.
- Referral by home school principal &/or Dane County social worker - [Referral Form](#)
- Males in grades 7 - 10
- Under current court supervision by Dane County Human Services and Juvenile Court System
- Student demonstrates significant behavioral challenges in school
- Duration of placement - One semester
